## Requirements for Admissions to Dual Enrollment

To enroll in dual enrollment courses at UT Permian Basin, students must:

- Be following the Texas Recommended or Distinguished Program;
- Be in the $1^{\text {st }}$ or $2^{\text {nd }}$ quarter of their high school graduating class. In addition, students in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ quarter of their graduating class must have one of the following minimum standardized test scores-SAT (CR+M) of 900 or higher; ACT of 19 or higher; or PSAT of 90 or higher; and
- Demonstrate college readiness by meeting the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) exemption or exam minimum score requirement in all three TSI areas-Mathematics, Reading, and Writing.
Students taking UTPB mathematics or science courses must meet satisfactory scores on placement tests that are higher than the minimum requirements for TSI testing requirements or TSI exemptions. The minimum placement test score required varies by course. Students who have already taken the "College Level Mathematics" section of the ACCUPLACER, COMPASS, or ASSET* exams may use that score for math or science placement. Current dual credit participants at UTPB will be eligible to continue in subsequent dual credit courses if they achieve a C or better in those courses. All new dual credit participants will be asked to meet the admission requirements (as stated above) and maintain a C or better in all courses.
*This test is not offered by UTPB, but scores are considered for TSI and placement.

The law requires all entering college students to be assessed for college readiness in mathematics, reading, and writing. If a student does not qualify for an exemption, then a student must take an approved assessment instrument such as the THEA, Quick THEA, ACCUPLACER, ASSET or COMPASS exam to determine college readiness and placement.

## TSI Exemptions/Exceptions

- For a period of five (5) years from the date of testing, a student who is tested and performs at or above the following standards:
- ACT: composite score of 23 with a minimum of 19 on both the English and the mathematics tests;
- SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test): a combined verbal (critical reading) and mathematics score of 1070 with a minimum of 500 on both the verbal (critical reading) and the mathematics tests; or
- TAKS (Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills): For a period of three (3) years from the date of testing, a student who is tested and performs on the $11^{\text {th }}$ grade exit-level TAKS with a minimum score of 2200 on the math section, and/or minimum scale score of 2200 on the English/Language Arts section plus a minimum score of 3 on the writing composition will be exempt from those corresponding sections.

Other exemptions/exceptions exist (i.e. previous military status, transfer student status from other colleges/universities (public or private)...). To review all exemptions/exceptions, please go to http://aa.utpb.edu/registrar/tsi-thea-information/ on the UTPB website.

## Texas Success Initiative Tests and Passing Standards

If a student is not exempt from TSI, there are several tests that can be taken for TSI purposes before the student enrolls. The tests are given by the colleges and universities and may include one or more of the tests listed below. UTPB offers the ACCUPLACER and the COMPASS exams through the PASS Office. Contact the PASS Office at (432) 552-2630 for testing information. UTPB may be able to arrange for an exam to be administered at a regional district school. UTPB will use the results from any of the exams listed below to satisfy the TSI requirement. Specific results from ACCUPLACER, COMPASS, or ASSET will be used for placement purposes in certain mathematics and science courses.

## Minimum Passing TSI Standards

Although higher scores may be needed to place in certain courses established by UTPB, the following minimum passing standards shall be used to determine if a student has met the TSI requirement:

- Elementary Algebra - 63;
- Written Essay - 6 or [Written Essay - 5 AND Sentence Structure - 80]
- ASSET:
- Reading Skills - 41;
- Elementary Algebra - 38;
- Written Essay - 6 or [Written Essay - 5 AND Writing Skills (multiple choice) - 40]
- COMPASS:
- Reading Skills - 81;
- Algebra - 39;
- Written Essay - 6 or [Written Essay - 5 AND Writing Skills (multiple choice) - 59]
- THEA:
- Reading - 230;
- Mathematics - 230;
- Writing - 220

## MATHEMATICS

UTPB will use either the ACCUPLACER or the COMPASS for placement purposes in Mathematics The following table has the minimum score ranges needed to be placed in Freshman/Sophomore level Math. Entry into MATH 2414 and 2415 (Calculus II \& III) requires credit for the preceding calculus course and cannot be determined by the placement exams.
